EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: Set in the Arizona territory during the opening months of the American Civil War, two soldiers from opposing sides must cooperate in order to survive a journey across the desert. *The War Between* is more than a war film, more than a western. Although possessing qualities of both genres, it is a unique story about a little-known chapter in the Civil War that speaks to today. *The War Between*, is the first feature to qualify for the new Arizona film tax incentive and was shot entirely on location in Arizona with a local crew. The combat scenes were shot in the same month and location as the actual battle.

She continues to work with veterans in telling their stories. Her earliest work documented the return of a displaced village because of the violent narco-wars in her father's homeland of Colombia. That experience continues to shape her direction in her work. She lives in Los Angeles.
